

DESCRIPTION	Equipping the Church for national transformation is the Evangelical Fellowship of Zimbabwe's strategic plan for 2025 – 2030. It will guide and inform concerted work to place the EFZ and its on-the-ground coordination mechanisms on a solid financial, capacity and unified footing. This is so that, the EFZ may better mobilise the goodwill, critical mass and diverse resources at its disposal. Firstly, to respond to the practical needs of poor and vulnerable societal groups in a context of perpetual droughts, poverty and inequality. Secondly, the EFZ will promote the empowerment and participation of children, youth, men, women, people with disabilities and other vulnerable groups in the processes, opportunities and benefits of development in their societies. Lastly, the EFZ will support church-led mobilisation to advance the integral mission of spreading the good news and promoting justice and peace in Zimbabwe.

Background

The Evangelical Fellowship of Zimbabwe (EFZ) is a Fellowship of over 1,000 Evangelical and Pentecostal denominations, para-church movements, ministries, and bible schools for Evangelical persuasion. It has a membership base of over 4 million Christians in Zimbabwe.

The EFZ was founded in 1962 by a few evangelical missionaries for the purpose of fellowship and ministering to each other's spiritual needs. Over the years EFZ grew to be a formidable organisation involved not only in the proclamation of the gospel but the development work as the demonstration of the gospel. The Fellowship which is now an alliance has not departed from the original cause which is to fellowship together and foster unity, identity and shared voice among evangelical Christians. Since its establishment, it has been facilitating fellowship and ministry of member bodies, ministering to the nation and providing humanitarian, relief, advocacy, counsel, peacebuilding and development services to and on behalf of the marginalized, victimized, disadvantaged and displaced in society.

Between February and June of 2024, the EFZ Secretariat engaged Provincial Leaders and key Stakeholders across nine of the ten Provinces of Zimbabwe in conversations to reflect on the past, understand the present and imagine the future. These conversations are the very essence of the choices and strategic directions underpinning the 2025 - 2030 Strategic Plan. They outline the meaningful strides undertaken throughout the 2019 - 2024 strategic period. While at the same time underscoring areas for improvement and opportunities for growth.

Key lessons learnt from 2019 – 2024 Strategic review

The 2019 – 2024 Strategy focused on three key objectives namely, 1. Rediscovering our Identity; 2. Rediscovering our Voice; and 3. Refreshing drive on Mission. These objectives were pursued in a context marked by much uncertainty and unmet needs among members of society. Beginning with the devastations of Operation Cyclone Idai in 2019 to the drought of 2024 the EFZ was frequently called to coordinate responses requiring the unity of purpose of member churches. In the public sphere, the voice of the EFZ has remained pronounced through consistent statements.

Stakeholder Expectations for 2025 – 2030

A sampling of key expectations from participants during the final Strategic Planning Workshop (Harare 2-3 December) illuminated a shared desire amongst stakeholders for the 2025 - 2030 EFZ Strategic Plan to respond to their needs and interests in more relevant and focused ways.



Context Analysis

Organisational Lenses

- o The new EFZ Constitution provides a strong premise to strengthen Governance mechanisms.
- o Capacitation of EFZ Coordination mechanisms at Provincial and Zonal levels will increase impact and relevance.
- o Women and Youth representative structures of the EFZ are not vibrant and are inadequately represented in leadership and decision-making.
- o A sustainable resource base comprising assets and investments is essential to sustain the longterm vision.
- o Effective communication platforms and presence are critical to reach the EFZ's broad base and diverse membership.
- o Improved Staff remuneration and conditions of service are key to retaining the current crop of motivated staff.

Developmental Lenses

- o Many Zimbabweans do not have access to quality health and education services.
- o The gap between the very rich and the very poor is widening.
- o Women and Youth are disproportionately affected by poverty and inequality.
- o Vulnerability and marginalisation amongst groups such as People with Disabilities (PWDs), the elderly, orphans and vulnerable children and prisoners are worsening.
- o Alcohol, drugs and substance abuse are prevalent among young people in both rural and urban areas.
- o The Climate crisis is an urgent and present danger affecting all of us today.

Transformational lenses

- o Moral decay manifests in many societal ills and latent conflicts in families, institutions and public life today.
- o In the absence of a shared vision and national values, the nation will struggle to unite and remain locked down in violent polarization.
- o Unresolved grievances and tensions contribute to an unsustainable peace.

- o A culture of corruption and impunity overshadows the rule of law and constitutionalism.

Organisational Strengthening

Summary

The EFZ's Organizational Strengthening Pillar aims to enhance its effectiveness in serving member churches. This will be achieved by: 1) revitalizing governance and coordination structures, ensuring transparency and accountability through the 2023 EFZ Constitution; 2) investing in leadership development through the EFZ Training and Discipling program; 3) establishing a dedicated media unit, including an Evangelical App, to improve communication and visibility; and 4) implementing a comprehensive resource mobilization strategy to support the 2025-2030 strategic plan. These initiatives will empower the EFZ to better serve its 4 million Christian members.

1.1. Strengthened EFZ governance and coordination structures at all levels

The EFZ will strengthen its governance mechanisms and coordination structures at national, provincial and zonal levels to ensure greater representation and ownership amongst member denominations and representative structures. Good corporate governance will enhance responsiveness to the needs and priorities of member denominations, and at the same time, it helps increase the credibility of church-led interventions. To this end, the EFZ will facilitate regular consultative and decision-making platforms in compliance with the provisions of the EFZ constitution. Additionally, the EFZ will coordinate timely elections for member representatives into key governance and coordination structures at national, provincial and thematic levels to ensure leadership and direction from below.

1.2. EFZ Training and Discipling Programme

The EFZ Training and Discipling programme will be open training, mentorship and skills development platform established to develop and strengthen critical capacities amongst leaders in the Church. Its major thrust will be to equip leaders in the Church with the tools and resources they require both to understand and respond to contemporary issues. As such, it will provide a diverse range of courses, programmes and learning opportunities tailor-made to suit the needs of church leaders working with communities, churches and in the marketplace. Topics to be covered include but are not limited to theological and developmental topics but will extend to key topics necessary to equip Church leaders to make meaningful contributions to the goal of holistic national transformation such as ethical business, counselling and psycho-social support, basic health care etc. Dynamic online, in-person and hybrid approaches will be utilised to increase the accessibility of courses and programmes to all Church leaders particularly those from rural areas. At the same time, the EFZ will work with member denominations to optimise existing facilities as training venues for various courses and programmes.

1.3. EFZ Media

EFZ Media a full-house information, education and communications department will be established as part of the EFZ Secretariat. The role and focus of EFZ Media will be to enhance the communication capability of the EFZ and to improve the visibility of the work of member denominations around the country. A strong media capability is important to help the EFZ play its roles to mobilise support for the vulnerable, influence national policies and coordinate the work of member churches. To this end, the EFZ will establish a state-of-the-art studio capable of producing and disseminating multi-media communications through social media, print, online radio, WhatsApp groups and other communicative vehicles. Additionally, EFZ Media will work with member denominations to generate content for different audiences which can, in turn, be showcased on shared platforms to increase reach and impact. The use of EFZ social media platforms will be optimised to increase accessibility and engagement with the estimated 4 million Evangelical Christians in Zimbabwe and the diaspora and ensuring access to critical information and updates including online bible versions, daily devotionals, hymn books, church service announcement etc.

1.4. EFZ Resource Mobilisation Architecture and Strategic Business Unit

The EFZ will create a sustainable resource base to support the implementation of the (2025 - 2030) strategic plan and ensure the long-term viability of EFZ operational structures. To this end, the EFZ will accelerate the implementation of the draft Resource mobilisation. The Resource Mobilisation Plan as approved by the EFZ leadership will be spearheaded by a Resource Mobilisation Committee at the Board level responsible for coordinating the EFZ resource mobilisation architecture at various levels. Four different funds with different yet complimentary intentions will be established to gather resources from various target groups as follows:

- 1. Growth Fund: The EFZ Growth Fund will aim to mobilise at least US\$1 million per annum to support major capital projects and long-term investments such as property, land and strategic assets. Resource Mobilisation for the Growth Fund will be spearheaded by the EFZ Board and Secretary General through high-level philanthropy networks, incentives and events.
- 2. Programme Fund: The EFZ Programme Fund will aim to mobilise at least US\$1.5 million per annum to support the implementation of donor-funded development programmes across the target areas and beneficiary groups identified in the EFZ strategic plan. Resource mobilisation for the Programme Fund will be done through donor roundtable meetings and Secretariat responses to calls for proposals.
- 3. Member subscriptions and Own income: EFZ member subscriptions and own income from EFZ merchandise and events will contribute to the EFZ Reserve Fund aimed at supporting regular EFZ events, networking and coordination. At least US\$200 000 per annum is expected to be mobilised through subscriptions from the +1 000 member denominations as well as other fundraising actions.
- **4. Fellowship Fund:** The EFZ Fellowship Fund will aim to raise at least US\$250 000 per annum from popular appeals and fundraising challenges in response to crises, unforeseen events or emerging needs. Resource mobilisation for this fund will rely on crowd-sourcing and first-time givers will contribute to church-led disaster response initiatives.
- **5. EFZ Strategic Business Unit:** The EFZ will establish a Strategic Business Unit whose mandate shall be to coordinate the EFZ's strategic business interests and presence in the marketplace.

To this end, the Strategic Business Unit will be tasked with identifying strategic business ventures which could contribute to the EFZ's financial sustainability without compromising the EFZ's values and principles.

Humanitarian Response and Environmental Stewardship

Summary

The EFZ's Humanitarian Response and Environmental Stewardship Pillar aims to improve the lives of vulnerable Zimbabweans facing poverty and climate change impacts. This will be achieved through WASH programs, climate resilience initiatives, food security measures, prisoner support, and strengthened support for church-run care facilities.

2.1. EFZ Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Programme

Construction of clean and safe community water sources as well as Water and Sanitation Health (WASH) interventions such as the construction of toilets will be expanded as part of efforts to promote human dignity and resilience to climate change. WASH projects typically comprise a package of interventions including borehole drilling, solarised water pumping, water storage facilities, toilet construction and drinking taps. These interventions are not only important to prevent waterborne diseases and increase climate resilience but also have the potential to unlock opportunities for increased agricultural production at church sites to provide food for food-insecure community members. To this end, EFZ will expand ongoing WASH programmes in Matebeleland North, Matebeleland South, Masvingo and Mashonaland West Provinces to cover four new Provinces namely Bulawayo, Mashonaland Central, Mashonaland East, and Midlands. At least 20 new boreholes and toilet blocks are expected to be constructed each year between 2025 and 2030 targeting marginalised rural and peri-urban locations where EFZ member denominations have a presence.

2.2 EFZ Schools and Health facilities Programme

The EFZ will coordinate with member denominations to support the development and/or improvement of at least 1 new school and Clinic each year between 2026 and 2030. These schools and clinics will be developed in marginalised rural and peri-urban areas where women and children lack access to adequate health and education facilities. Partnerships with Government and community stakeholders will be established to ensure the sustainability of construction projects. At the same time schools and clinic development projects will integrate conflict transformation approaches aimed at leveraging development processes to advance social cohesion in polarised communities. Fundraising for schools and clinic construction projects will primarily be done as part of the EFZ Growth Fund — a funding pool specifically designed for member denominations to access funding for capital projects.

2.3. Food and Nutrition Security Programmes

In response to the high levels of hunger and food insecurity amongst vulnerable groups such as orphans, child-headed households, the elderly and People with disabilities the EFZ will work through member denominations to establish church-led Food Banks and Supplementary Meals Programmes in targeted areas. Food Banks will enable the regular collection of foodstuffs for distribution to those in need. At the same time, Supplementary Feeding Programmes will provide regular meals at accessible sites such as schools and church premises to identified groups and individuals. Provincial and Zonal coordination structures of the EFZ will be responsible for the coordination of food banks and supplementary feeding programmes working through volunteers. At least 1,000 sites are expected to be in operation by 2030 with the capacity to provide at least 10,000 meals for vulnerable people around the country each day. Food Bank and Supplementary Meals Programmes will be accompanied by opportunities for learning, prayer and reflection.

2.4. Climate Resilience and DRR Communities Programme

The EFZ will intervene to enhance the resilience of households and communities affected by ongoing climate change pressures. Pervasive impacts of climate change have negatively affected livelihoods, agricultural productivity, gender relations and the survivability of many areas around Zimbabwe. For the majority of Zimbabweans who depend on rain-fed agriculture, climate change has resulted in reduced crop yields and poorer standards of living. Making the transition towards climate-adapted agricultural production and livelihoods is therefore key to the prospects of those affected by climate change. To this end, the EFZ will mobilise member denominations to increase the climate resilience of affected communities through climate awareness-raising programmes, distribution of climate-proofed agricultural inputs, drilling of boreholes and alternative livelihoods. In particular, the EFZ will help advance the 'Farming God's Way' approach aimed at enhancing smallholder farmers' ability to mitigate climate impacts whilst sustaining viable agricultural livelihoods. At a policy level, the EFZ will continue advocating for climate-just-public resources and policies to increase the resilience of climate-affected communities and households.

2.5 Prisoner support programme

Continuing with the Church's historic role of supporting the welfare, rehabilitation and reintegration of Prisoners, the EFZ will consolidate the disparate efforts of member churches to care for and assist prisoners currently serving at various facilities, into a harmonised Prisoner Support Programme. This is important to reduce competition and enhance the collective impact of the Church's work in the prison system. Hence, under this Programme the EFZ will help coordinate the work of Chaplains, Counsellors, Paralegals, affected families and Volunteers so that their efforts will complement each other and contribute to the rehabilitation of the maximum possible number of prisoners. Crucial to this work will be efforts to support and assist families affected by prison experiences through family-focused initiatives targeting families experiencing challenges such as trauma, social stigma and the loss of a breadwinner associated with imprisonment. Other activities to be conducted under the Prison Support Programme include regular prison visits to minister to inmates, church services and special events during holidays, distribution of bibles and provision of counselling and para-legal support. In addition, the EFZ will mobilise resources to minister to the basic practical needs of prisoners such as soap, foodstuffs, medications and clothing by their stated needs. Lastly, the EFZ will collaborate with Pastors in member denominations to assist with family and community reintegration of prisoners following incarceration through family counselling and mediation processes.

2.6. Children's Villages and Elderly Peoples' Homes Support (Care and Compassion) programme

EFZ member churches and para-legal organisations directly run or support more than 100 children's villages and Elderly People's Homes all around the country. However, many of these Institutions are struggling to fully support the growing numbers of Orphaned and Vulnerable Children as well as the Elderly who have no other places to call home. In light of this, the EFZ will establish a Coordination Structure responsible for working with member church denominations to identify and prioritise the varying needs at Children's Homes and Elderly Homes around the country. Based on this information, the Committee is then expected to spearhead resource mobilisation drives to gather resources for various needs and projects. The spectrum of needs to be addressed includes foodstuffs, blankets, clothing and volunteer time to assist children's villages and elderly people's homes. Projects may also include the construction of new facilities, livelihood initiatives, food gardens, boreholes and solarisation according to varying needs and priorities. EFZ's resource mobilisation will include a Fellowship Fund and targeted fundraising to provide essential supplies, infrastructure, and livelihood support. The EFZ will also strengthen member church capacity in care management, ensuring adherence to global standards.

Key initiatives include: a Youth Leadership Development Program, training provincial leaders to address local challenges; a Gender Justice and Women Empowerment Program; and advocacy for constitutionalism, socio-economic justice, and peacebuilding through dialogue and engagement. The EFZ will leverage church traditions and collaborate with ZHOCD to facilitate national conflict resolution.

3.1. Children and Youth Leadership Development Programme

The EFZ will contribute towards the growth and development of a generation of young leaders with the ability to solve contemporary challenges and envision the future in a manner that demonstrates a commitment to shared values. To this end, the EFZ will coordinate with member denominations and para-Church organisations to organise a calendar of youth leadership development programmes and mentorship cycles targeting young leaders in high schools and tertiary universities. These youth leadership development programmes will comprise a dynamic mix of activities including youth camps, outreaches, social media platforms, on-campus events, exchange programmes, practical volunteerism and exposure visits. National and provincial level coordinating committees comprising youth representatives and para-Church organisations will be set up to organise youth leadership development activities culminating in the Annual EFZ Youth Leadership Conference. This Annual Conference will provide young leaders within the EFZ orbit to share ideas, experiences and solutions for the future.

3.2. Women empowerment programmes

The EFZ will expand the work of the Gender Development Commission and the Women's Fellowship structures all around the country to promote gender justice and the holistic empowerment of women and girls through church-led economic empowerment, networking activities and advocacy campaigns targeting women and young girls. Economic empowerment activities will take the form of livelihoods training, Income Savings and Loans Schemes, food fairs, market days and Business Expos. These economic activities will serve to create opportunities for female entrepreneurs to market their goods and services and for them to open new markets. Platforms for networking and information exchange will also be created to expand opportunities for learning and personal growth amongst female entrepreneurs, whilst at the same time exposing female entrepreneurs to mentors who can provide support and guidance. Advocacy campaigns on gender justice concerns particularly equitable access and control to land and economic opportunities will be initiated through national and provincial structures to advocate for gender-just policies and gender mainstreaming in the management of public resources.

3.3. Constitutionalism, governance and democracy building

The EFZ will contribute towards the realisation of the shared ideals of constitutionalism, governance and democracy building through church-led lobby and advocacy initiatives targeting duty-bearers and change makers in the executive, judiciary and parliament through the following key interventions:

- 1. Constitutional literacy and advocacy. The EFZ will promote efforts to increase popular awareness of the constitution and commitment to support its implementation. This will be done through the distribution of Informational, Educational and Communication (IEC) materials on the constitution in all of the country's languages. These IEC materials will be distributed through strategic church information networks and complimented by regular multistakeholder workshops to promote adherence to the constitution and address factors hindering constitutionalism. Work on the constitution will also benefit from long-standing collaborations with progressive Civil Society Organisations and Academia to raise a common voice in defence of the constitution.
- 2. **Governance and Electoral reforms.** The EFZ will continue advocating for just and equitable reforms to address the perennial governance and electoral challenges facing Zimbabwe. These challenges pointedly manifest in rampant corruption, disdain for the rule of law and disputed elections. In response to this, the EFZ will utilise advocacy instruments such as Pastoral Letters, Parliamentary Engagements, Prayer Meetings, Church-led Campaigns, Lobby Meetings, Pastoral Visits etc to promote just and equitable governance and electoral reforms. Related to

- this work the EFZ Election Monitoring Team will monitor and observe all elections providing the nation a credible non-partisan witness and recommendations.
- 3. Democracy building. The EFZ will continue to work to facilitate the further democratisation of decision-making and resource sharing in Zimbabwe by promoting the informed participation of the EFZ Christian community in key decision-making processes such e.g. local and national budgeting, devolution process, Parliamentary Public Hearings, Chapter 12 Commissions' public engagements and local development meetings. In this regard, the EFZ will periodically share relevant information and updates on key democratic processes using church information channels and popular media.

3.4. Socio-economic Justice Programme

The EFZ will actively promote social and economic justice for those marginalised and dispossessed by unfair social, economic, cultural and political processes. The prevalence of such processes and their unrestrained effects on people's everyday lives have resulted in Zimbabwe becoming a highly unequal society at the expense of groups such as the youth, women, people living with disabilities mining-affected communities, landless and peasant farmers, migrants, the uneducated, and numerous other groups left outside. This systemic exclusion and marginalisation of downtrodden groups have their basis in the adoption and implementation of unjust policies which tend to benefit certain groups over others. To this end the EFZ will focus its voice, critical mass and agency on promoting justice in three mutually related areas namely:

- 1. **Resolution of the debt crisis:** The EFZ will contribute to measures to resolve Zimbabwe's debt crisis by raising awareness of the debt situation, calling for transparency in debt contraction and urging the international community and creditors to cancel debts and provide fair and predictable sovereign debt work-out mechanisms for highly indebted countries like Zimbabwe.
- 2. **Just and equitable taxation:** The EFZ will advocate for just and equitable taxation as a means to generate sufficient national resourcing to finance robust public service delivery and the general improvement in the quality of life. This entails sustained lobby and advocacy e.g. the adoption of the proposed global 15% minimum taxation on Foreign Direct Investments proposed by the United Nations, the halt of unjust tax incentives for foreign investors and the reduction in the over-taxation of the informal sector and other already marginalised groups.
- 3. **Reduction of corruption and illicit financial flows:** The EFZ will work together with Civil Society partners, media and academia to spotlight and urge collective action to reduce rampant corruption and illicit financial flows. This will be done through regular advocacy campaigns, multi-stakeholder engagements, pastoral letters and investigative reporting.
- 4. **Reversal of austerity measures:** Within the context of local and national budgeting processes the EFZ will mobilise Christians and member churches to urge for the reversal of austerity measures and to promote increased public investments in basic social service delivery and public welfare programmes such as the Basic Education Assistance Module and a potential basic income grant for vulnerable groups.

3.5. Peace-building and Conflict Transformation Initiatives

The EFZ will establish a peace-building and conflict transformation architecture of trained men and women to help resolve festering conflicts at national, provincial and local levels working with likeminded organizations. Unresolved conflicts carry the risk of exploding into open conflicts if they are not resolved in a manner that underscores the value of a just and sustainable peace. In this regard, there is a need to prepare the church to make a meaningful contribution to the resolution of the complex political, electoral, tribal, gender, class, generational and resource-based conflicts affecting the nation. To do so, the EFZ will train and establish local and provincial Peace Practitioner Committees responsible for initiating church-led conflict transformation processes at a local level. These Committees will principally convene dialogue and engagement meetings to mediate between conflicting actors and seek lasting resolution to conflict drivers. Additionally, the Committees will coordinate with the National Peace and Reconciliation Commission (NPRC), Parliament and other bodies to facilitate the voice and participation of the church in official peace-building processes. At a national level, the EFZ will contribute to the Zimbabwe Heads of Christian Denominations' (ZHOCD) Eminent Persons Group, tasked to rally the combined efforts of the four main Church mother bodies. 1 to mediate national-level conflicts particularly those between and amongst the dominant political elites and their parties, between the rulers and the ruled, between the haves and the have-notes and lastly, the conflicts between Zimbabwe and the international community. This work of the ZHOCD is guided by a ZHOCD Vision, Advocacy, Dialogue and Engagement Framework. Six leaders from EFZ member churches seconded to work with the ZHOCD Eminent Person Group will be responsible for channelling the voice and perspectives of the EFZ in the ZHOCD's national-level peace-building and conflict transformation work.

4.1. Church and Community Transformation Programme

The EFZ will lead the coordination of denominations, theological institutions, peer agencies and communities in the assimilation of the Church and Community Transformation (CCT) programme. CCT is a transformation development tool that is holistic as it facilitates for both the spiritual and physical transformation of people and communities. Having practised CCT for the past 12 years, EFZ will assume a coordination role to influence a wider range of organisations, institutions and denominations to integrate CCT in their programming, curricula and broader development formulae. EFZ has worked in 100 communities across the country and its strategic intent moving forward to extend its reach to not just communities but to key institutions that work in and with communities for their development and transformation.

4.2. Gospel Crusades and Evangelistic Campaigns

In the advancement of the EFZ's founding purpose to contribute to the achievement of the Great Commission to spread the gospel, the EFZ will accelerate the holding of Gospel crusades and evangelistic campaigns in all the Provinces of Zimbabwe. Gospel crusades and evangelistic campaigns are a key aspect of the EFZ's evangelical movement's mandate to transform the nation through the Gospel. Over the years the EFZ has partnered with renowned Evangelists such as Reinhard Bonnke, Joyce Meyer, Luis Palau and others to spread the gospel to hundreds of thousands of Zimbabweans during mega crusades. In keeping with this tradition the EFZ will continue facilitating major gospel crusades, through providing technical support, local clearances, bookings and approvals, linkages to member churches and networking with para-church organisations in various communities. Hence between 2025 and 2030, the EFZ anticipates supporting at least 2 major gospel crusades hosted by an International partner. Each major crusade will be complemented by community outreaches, leadership engagements and church planting processes by member churches. In addition to Gospel Crusades alongside International Partners, the EFZ will collaborate with member churches, and Provincial and Zonal structures to organise collective gospel and evangelistic events such as Worship Services, Choral Competitions, and National Prayer Services etc.

4.3. Zimbabwe We Want National Vision Process

The EFZ will contribute to a national envisioning process aimed at formulating a shared collective vision to carry the nation forward. This envisioning process is an iteration of the Zimbabwe We Want initiative of the 2000s through which the church successfully managed to bring the nation together to formulate a discussion document containing recommendations and alternatives for the future. Integrating the lessons learnt and experiences from the first Zimbabwe We Want process the EFZ will rally together with the other mother church bodies in the ZHOCD to bring the nation together again to dialogue and engage towards a new shared national vision. Following the formulation and adoption of a shared national vision, the Church anticipates the adoption of cohesive values and principles to guide the peaceful conduct of the affairs of the nation.

4.4. Social Cohesion Campaigns

The EFZ will initiate a series of social cohesion campaigns aimed at transforming the levels of polarisation and division into unity and togetherness. This is very important in light of the high levels of intolerance and militancy in the national rhetoric, which frequently serve to ferment divisions amongst the people. In this regard, the EFZ will work to challenge divisive narratives and militant rhetoric by promoting messages that point attention to the things that unite rather than divide Zimbabweans, as well as profiling the work of the Church to bring people together in harmony. To this end, the EFZ will periodically implement campaigns to stimulate social cohesion amongst Zimbabweans from all walks of life in a non-political and non-threatening manner. To this end, the social cohesion campaigns of the EFZ will focus on creating messages and platforms for Zimbabweans to push back against unnecessary hate and divisions along tribal, race, gender, class, religious and other fault lines. At the same time, the EFZ social cohesion campaigns will aim to give voice to those who are excluded from dominant societal narratives or forced to self-censor out of fear of repression. Thus by creating safe spaces for all people to voice their views and perspectives the EFZ anticipates fostering great understanding and tolerance with less resort to violence and marginalisation when addressing societal differences.

4.5. Schools and Campus Ministries

The EFZ will coordinate its members presence in Schools and Tertiary Institutions in Zimbabwe. Many member churches have a presence at university and tertiary institutions, however, there is limited collaboration and joint activities on campus. To this end, the EFZ will develop a coordination structure to help member churches to have an effective and unified presence on various schools and campuses. The same structure will also be beneficial in networking schools and tertiary students to the EFZ's broader work in the nation. In addition, the Campus platform will also benefit from the representation of the EFZ in the University Chaplaincy Association which provides formal coordination for the work of the church on university and tertiary campuses.
